Tomato plant tips that Dee has provided will be coming in a spring time newsletter.

SURENAME:			Quantity
CONTACT NUMBER:	Tomato 'Pink Bumble Bee'	This a wonderful Artisan series tomato that bears super sweet fruit. It has an excellent fruity flavour with low acid and good resistance to cracking. Early maturing variety.	
	Tomato 'Tigerella'	One of my fav's, it's a great yielding tomato, producing enormous crops of delicious redyellow striped tomatoes with exceptional flavour. Fruits in 10 weeks from transplant and continues to yield for months, up to 20kg of fruit per plant!	
	Tomato 'Sunrise Bumble Bee'	Holding well on the vine, these are summer jewels of sweetness best enjoyed straight from the bush. As sweet as Tommy Toe this tomato is a must for the vegie garden this summer.	
	Tomato 'Wapsipinicon Peach'	Impossible to pronounce but well worth growing, this heirloom has a complex, spicy sweet flavour. Creamy-yellow fruit is covered by a fine fuzz.	
	Tomato 'Tommy Toe'	Very tasty sweet 3cm fruit produced from January to May. Fruits in 10 weeks from transplant and yields 11kg per plant.	
	Tomato 'Jaune Flammee'	Fruits in just 7 weeks from transplant. With large amounts of carotene, orange tomatoes have almost as much beta-carotene as carrots! Yields 6.5kg/plant.	
	Tomato 'Green Grape'	Delicious olive green fruit with a with a refreshing lemon zest are produced in abundance on this compact plant. Harvest in 10-12 weeks, yields 4.9kg/plant. Determinant variety perfect for pots.	
	Tomato 'Grosse Lisse'	A great all-rounder with awesome flavour. Fruits in 12 weeks from transplant and yields 16.4kg of fruit per plant with an average fruit size of 200g.
