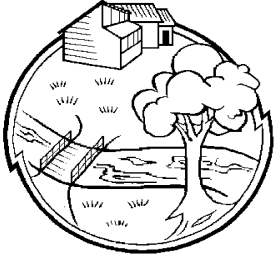
These are volunteer positions. The committee usually meets every three months and reasonable travel costs will be covered.
