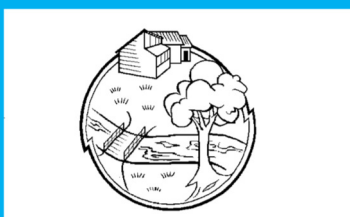

Helping at Home Hints – Write Creatively

Because creative writing is fun, it is an excellent way to foster a love of writing. It also helps develop your child's imagination, which has been proven to be important in critical thinking and problem solving. You can use a book you have recently read together as a source of inspiration, or create something new. Some ideas for writing creatively include:

- Create a short story in cartoon form
- Cut out pictures of people from magazines and create speech bubbles and dialogue
- Create your own superhero and have them go on a short adventure
- Use artworks found on the web, such as paintings and photographs, as inspiration for a story
- Write a story or create a cartoon together by taking turns at writing sentences or cartoon cells

A simple story (narrative) structure involves a character who has a goal (for example: to win the football match; to find a lost dog; to save the world) but faces problems in achieving that goal. This structure can be the basis for a short story you write together. Give your child the opportunity to discover new things, to explore new interests, and to participate in their family, community and culture. These all help to develop a positive attitude towards learning and school.
