Learning Preview

The school-wide Spelling focus for the next week will be on 'ar/a' as in 'car and banana'. We start next week with a focus on 'Narrative Writing' (Purpose – to tell a story). Our social skills focus from Respectful Relationships will be 'Topic 6: Help Seeking'. In Maths, students will be completing their 'multiplication' post-tests and begin working on Statistics and Data.

Helping at Home Hints – Mathematics at home

Maths is an important part of everyday life and there are lots of ways you can make it fun for your child. Talk together and have fun with numbers and patterns. Help your child to:

- Find numbers around your home and neighbourhood – clocks, letterboxes, speed signs
- Count forwards and backwards (clocks, fingers and toes, letterboxes, action rhymes, signs)
- Make patterns when counting "clap 1, stamp 2, clap 3, stamp 4, clap 5..."
- Do sums using objects such as stones or marbles e.g. $2 + 3$, $4 + 1$, $5 + 4$
- Make up number stories – "you have 2 brothers and 2 sisters. There are 4 of them"
- Challenge your child to find as many ways as they can in one minute to make a number using addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.
- Practise timetables daily.

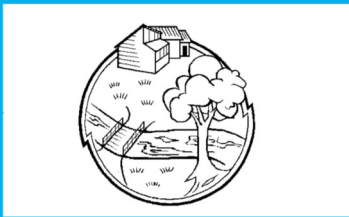
